Scholarships and Awards

Scholarships and awards are designed to give outstanding students financial and academic support while they study at post-secondary institutions. Scholarships and awards are offered in a wide range of disciplines and selection may be based on any number of arbitrary criteria, including: financial need, academic achievement, athletic achievement, public service, nationality or ethnicity.

A significant number of scholarships and awards offered are available because of generous endowments and sponsorships provided by alumni, business and governments to encourage and financially support students.

This booklet is designed to provide an introduction to your search for the scholarship or award that suits you, your goals and aspirations.

Much of this booklet has been reproduced from BC Awards Online, the online database of scholarships, bursaries, and awards for B.C. students maintained and updated by the Greater Victoria School District with funding provided by the Ministry of Education. BC Awards Online includes hundreds of awards available to B.C. students and will help you get one of them!

Descriptions of Awards administered by SIDES and SD #63(Saanich) are listed in this booklet. The application form at the back of this booklet must be submitted along with a curriculum vitae and transcript of marks in order to be considered.

DEFINITIONS

| Award | An award may be based on financial need (e.g. a bursary, loan or work-study program) or on academic merit or excellence in an area (e.g. a scholarship). |
| Bursary | A bursary is a non-repayable monetary award based on financial need and reasonable academic standing as determined by the donor. |
| Loan | A loan is a repayable monetary award based on financial need. |
| Scholarship | A scholarship is a monetary award based on academic merit or excellence in an area to which the award pertains. |
| Entrance Scholarship | An entrance scholarship is a scholarship available to students who are proceeding from Grade 12 to studies in a particular post-secondary institution. |
| Admission Scholarship | An admission scholarship is a scholarship that is automatically awarded based on the student's application for admission to the institution. |
| Approved/Accredited Program | A program at a post-secondary institution or apprenticeship program approved/accredited by the Ministry of Advanced Education as listed at their website (www.aved.gov.bc.ca/studentervices/des_schools/). |
| Designated Post-Secondary Institution | A post-secondary institution approved for Canada Student Loans. |

STRATEGY

Apply for as many scholarships as possible. Be prepared to spend time and effort; successful scholarship applications are the result of care, good supporting documents, and attention to detail.

1. Begin EARLY in the school year.
2. Choose the scholarships and bursaries for which you are realistically eligible. Make sure the award applies to secondary school students entering a post-secondary institution and not just to students already attending.
3. Obtain the application forms, make photocopies of them, and use them as rough drafts. Splotches of whiteout do not create a good impression.
4. Complete the applications forms, ask for letters of reference and recommendation, and procure all relevant documents. Most applications are available online: www.bcawardsonline.sd61.bc.ca For the awards administered by the Saanich School District, which includes SIDES, application forms are available from the school counsellor.
5. MAKE PARTICULAR NOTE OF DEADLINES. Check whether the deadline date is the date the application must be received or whether it is the date the application must be postmarked. Deadlines are subject to change and may have changed from what is listed in BC Awards Online. Students should always check the most recent application form or with the donor or institution to ensure that the deadline date they are using is accurate.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

1. Check that you meet the criteria. Follow the application instructions accurately and exactly.
2. If the application requires a letter, make sure the letter is neat, accurate, and legible.
 - a. Use 8 1/2 x 11 inch white paper.
 - b. Use **one** side only.
 - c. Use standard business style.
 - d. Include identity, academic standing, participation in school and community activities, future plans.
 - e. Be straightforward, concise and unemotional.
 - f. Check whether application must be typed or handwritten.
 - g. Use a **clean, easy to read** type.
3. If an award is restricted, include detailed and precise information which makes clear your eligibility for the award. You may need to write a separate letter.

LETTERS OF APPLICATION AND RESUMES

The importance of a good letter of application cannot be overemphasized since it is the usual basis for screening candidates. A good letter of application takes a great deal of time, effort, thought and revision; it is often the difference between a candidate being considered or rejected.

Follow a format which includes the following information:

- a. brief outline of interests, hobbies and activities.
- b. brief summary of positions and offices held in school, youth organizations and the community. Grades 10, 11, and 12 are usually sufficient; however, some require Grade 8 and 9 as well.
- c. short statement of purpose in seeking to attend university.
- d. information on awards, scholarships and prizes won in any field.
- e. details of employment in the last two years.

When an application does not specifically require a letter, it is a good idea to include a resume. A resume for a scholarship application has a different emphasis from a resume for employment. Like a letter of application, a good resume requires time, effort, thought and revision. A resume should be no more than ONE page.

LETTERS OF REFERENCE

Many applications require letters of reference or recommendation, which often form an important part in a committee's decision. It is important, therefore, to give careful consideration to your choice of referees. Ask adults who know you well, but who are **not** members of your family. Employers, coaches, principals, teachers, ministers, and neighbours are all possibilities. Choose people who are familiar with your achievements in school, athletics, student government, community service, employment, and other extra-curricular activities.

Be sure to tell your referees specifically what you need and give them plenty of time because writing a good letter of reference requires time, effort, and thought. Give your referees copies of your resume to help them be thorough in their recommendations.

RESUMES

This will take approximately 2 to 3 pages to present if properly laid out on a computer.

In addition, if there are any illustrations of your successes, eg. certificates, awards, examples of your successes, they could be photocopied and attached at the back.

If you want to see an example of a resume, there are examples available from your counsellor.

You need to supply a transcript of your marks obtainable from the school office. and possibly a copy of acceptance of the Post Secondary Institution you have chosen.

SOCIAL INSURANCE NUMBERS AND REPORTING SCHOLARSHIPS FOR INCOME TAX PURPOSES

Students must have a valid Social Insurance Number (SIN) to register for Provincial Government Exams, to be eligible for District Scholarships, and for income tax purposes. To apply for a SIN, you must complete an application form which can be obtained from the website (www.hrsdc.gc.ca) or from your local Human Resource Centre of Canada office. In Victoria, the offices are at 3962 Borden Street and 1260 Government Street (phone 727-6551).

Students will be issued tax receipts for scholarships they receive because awards in excess of \$500 are considered taxable by Revenue Canada. Therefore in order to prepare the tax receipts, some scholarship application forms will ask for a student's Social Insurance Number or students may need to provide their SIN before they can receive their award. If students receive scholarships for programs for which they can claim an education amount for their income tax (in other words, if they are attending a post-secondary institution in the same year as they receive their scholarships), they will need to report for income tax purposes only any scholarship amounts over \$3000. Students should refer to the current year's guide, P105 Students and Income Tax, available at the Canada Revenue Agency's website (www.cra-arc.gc.ca).

ORGANIZATION OF AWARDS

Awards included in **BC Awards Online** are organized into sections. Each section includes general information about awards in that section and a listing of awards. In addition, the Awards Deadline Search lists scholarship/bursary application deadlines by month while the Alphabetic Listing is an alphabetical listing of all awards.

Government Scholarships/Awards

These awards include the Passport to Education, the Provincial and District Scholarship Programs, the Premier's Excellence Awards and the Governor-General's Bronze Academic Medal.

Awards Administered by Your School District

These awards are administered by particular school districts and are, in most cases, only available to students attending public schools within that district. They are tenable at various recognized post-secondary institutions.

Open Awards

These awards are administered by AUCC (Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada), UBC, private donors, unions, foundations and associations. They are generally tenable at most recognized post-secondary institutions.

UVic Awards

These awards are administered by UVic and are tenable only at UVic.

UBC Awards

These awards are administered by UBC and are tenable only at UBC.

SFU Awards

These awards are administered by SFU and are tenable only at SFU.

Awards from other B.C. Post-Secondary Institutions

These awards are administered by individual institutions in B.C. and are tenable only at those institutions.

Awards from Post-Secondary Institutions Outside B.C.

These awards are administered by post-secondary institutions outside B.C. and are tenable only at those institutions.

Athletic Awards

These awards are given for athletic achievement. Some are tenable only at a particular institution; some may be used at any recognized post-secondary institution.

Awards Administered by the Saanich School District and SIDES

The awards in this section are administered by the Saanich School District Scholarship and Bursary Committee and are only available to students attending **public** schools in the Saanich School District. SIDES bursaries are administered by the SIDES Scholarship & Awards Committee. Students interested in applying for any of these awards, need to submit the **application form in the front of this booklet** and a **curriculum vitae** to the school counsellor by June 1st.
